## GETTING READY FOR YOUR LIT EXPERIENCE


- The suggested maximum number of students is 20 per classroom/space.
- Maximum six classrooms/spaces per experience
- A teacher, Adult, or chaperone must always be in the room during the experience.
- *Adult participation in our experience is highly encouraged!*

## CLASSROOM SETUP



B, C: Position Speakers as close to the monitor as possible

- POSITION THE STUDENTS AS THE DIAGRAM DICTATES AND AS CLOSE TO THE SCREEN/MONITOR/SMART BOARD AS POSSIBLE.
- MAKE SURE ALL STUDENTS ARE SEATED IN A LINE, WITH A CLEAR VIEW OF THE MONITOR/SCREEN - NO ONE SHOULD BE SITTING DIRECTLY BEHIND ANYONE ELSE.
- PLEASE USE NAME TAGS (THESE ARE PROVIDED IN YOUR DOSSIER PACKET). PLEASE USE A SHARPIE AND WRITE FIRST NAMES AS LARGE AS POSSIBLE).

## INSTALLING ZOOM

- Visit [zoom.com](https://zoom.us) to download and install zoom
- When it is time for the show to begin, go to *(insert show link)*
- Test your camera and microphone
- Stay in the waiting room until your host begins the session.

## ASSIGNING THE GROUP SPEAKER/S

- Please assign one or two of the students to be the speakers for the team. These students will serve as the primary communicators for your team, between your classroom and our actors. This means other students will confer and collaborate to develop questions and comments that the speaker can express, ask, and challenge the characters (actors) in the experience!
- The speakers should be positioned closest to the monitor/screen.
- Please look at the diagram for where to position the speaker/s best for everyone's maximum enjoyment.
- You know your group better than our team; if the class can be managed without speakers, that's great!
- Hand-raising and other respectful classroom rules already in place are highly encouraged and appreciated.
